Cynthia, an American who would years later become his wife, muse and business partner, arrived in Bali in 1982, as a stopover on a round-the-world trip. Also inspired by the country, she stayed in Bali and started a small, successful jewelry business of her own. In 1989, the pair enjoyed a professional collaboration that turned out to be magical.



From the beginning, John and Cynthia's approach to business has been about making jewelry while being respectful to Bali's land, its environment, its people and its culture.

Like everything else in John and Cynthia's life, it became their mission to share with others the educational benefits that they were fortunate enough to provide their children.

The Green School opened in September 2008 as a realization of that vision and offers education that promotes learning from real life situations that promote an understanding of and stewardship for the environment.

With this vision for a different world rooted in education that embraces holistic learning, John and Cynthia hope that Green School will become a "seed" that will change the paradigm for education.

C.K. PRAHALAD

C.K. Prahalad, the Paul and Ruth McCracken Distinguished University Professor at the Ross School of Business, University of



Michigan, specializes in corporate strategy. His books include *Multinational Mission: Balancing Local Demands and Global Vision* (1987), co-authored with Yves Doz, *Competing for the Future* (1994), co-authored with Gary Hamel, *The Future of Competition: Co-Creating Unique Value with Customers* (2004) co-authored with Venkatram Ramaswamy, and Fortune at the *Bottom of the Pyramid: Eradicating Poverty through Profit*, which was selected as one of the best books of 2004 by The Economist, Fast Company and Amazon.com.

He has been honored for his contributions with a Life Time Achievement Award by the Ross School of Business. He received honorary doctorates from the University of London (Economics), Stevens Institute of Technology (Engineering), University of Abertay, Dundee (Business) and University of Tilberg (Business). He was a member of the United Nations Blue Ribbon Commission on Private Sector and Development.

A prominent world-class figure, Professor Prahalad was named number one in the Thinkers 50 (the most influential thinkers in management alive today) poll conducted by Suntop media and the Times of London. He has consulted with the top management of many of the world's foremost companies. He serves on the Board of Directors of NCR Corporation, Teradata Corporation, Hindustan Unilever Limited and the World Resources Institute. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of The Indus Entrepreneurs (TiE) a global organization devoted to democratizing entrepreneurship.

KRISHNAMMAL JAGANNATHAN

Krishnammal, along with her husband S. Jagannathan, was a freedom fighter, Sarvodaya leader, Gandhian, and Dalit activist. As a young woman, she knew Gandhi, and later traveled throughout India with Vinoba Bhave. In 1981, Krishnammal founded Land for Tillers Freedom (LAFTI), serving hundreds of impoverished villages throughout the Nagapattinam and Thiruvavur districts of Tamilnadu. Most of her projects are directed towards uplifting women and their families.

Krishnammal is the recipient of many awards in India, including the Jannalal Bajaj Award (1988), Padmashri (1989), and the Bhagwan Mahveer Award (1996) for her social service work throughout India. In addition, she was nominated twice for the Right Livelihood Award, and she was part of the 1000 Women for Peace project, nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2005. Krishnammal is currently touring the U.S. prior to going to Seattle University to receive the Opus Prize in November. She will also be one of the four recipients of the 2008 Right Livelihood Award, an award frequently referred to as the "Alternative Nobel Peace Prize", which will be presented in a ceremony at the Swedish Parliament on December 8.

The Jaipur Investors provided startup capital for Planned Social Concern, a Grameen replicator launched by Project Concern International in February, 2007. In its first 18 months, the program has provided loans to more than 1,800 women to support businesses that allow them to improve their own lives and those of their families. The program is now fully financially sustainable and ready to welcome new investors with an interest in expanding its reach.

There is no software to load for sender or receiver. You may *Forward, Request, Track* deliveries. Use the Menu to explore other options. The solution supports files sizes up to 100Mb or more, well beyond the limits of email attachments.
